Lately I seem to find myself feeling very frustrated with the "me-first" mentality that is becoming more a part of our society. Things that are just common courtesy are overlooked because people are just in too much of a hurry or too absorbed in what is going on with themselves to notice anything else around them. Recently, I have had two separate encounters with what I would guess to be homeless men. The first encounter was on one of our bitterly cold days on my way to church. I saw a man holding a cardboard sign, so I turned my vehicle around to talk with him and offer to get him something to eat. He was standing at an intersection with two turn lanes. When I got back to him, the light turned green as I gave him the food, a cup of hot coffee, and directions to the mission. The woman behind me became aggravated right away, honked, and gave us a dirty look as she drove around us to make the green light. He was offended by it and my heart ached more for her than it did for this unfortunate man. She was blessed to be in a newer vehicle with a nice warm house to go home to, yet unwilling to take the opportunity to help or pass quietly by as someone else did. The other man "Steve" was standing near the entrance to a busy store and called out to a couple in front of me who didn't even acknowledge him as they walked by. As I watched that, I thought of how hurtful it must be to be considered too low to talk to. When he came up to me, he said he was hungry. My mother gave him some money and he told us his name. As I introduced myself, I shook his hand. With his toothless smile, he told me how hard it is to meet nice people. He and I both talked about God and how He gifts everybody differently and how He never leaves us. Hebrew 13:1-3 reminds us "Do not to forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it" and Hebrews 13:5-6 "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." So we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?"

It is said that Charlie Chaplin once entered a Charlie Chaplin look-a-like contest and lost. What an awesome thing to know that God would never mistake our identity or forget who we are. He loves us all fairly and unconditionally. He doesn't hold us in higher or lower esteem based on our "status" in society. I encourage you to pray for opportunities to help others. Pay attention to what is happening around you and please extend courtesy and respect to others. It can be as simple as saying hello, opening a door for someone, helping someone with their groceries, or letting the other driver have the closer parking spot you had your eye on. Respect can be such a small gesture with such great rewards.
